[How waste from old coal mine is powering a Bitcoin mine in a Pennsylvania town](#) - It could be part of the future of digital currency, it could be a new way to clean up the environment, or it could be both. At the Panther Creek plant in Carbon County, Pennsylvania, the waste from old coal mines is being used to power a Bitcoin mine.

[In 2021 U.S. natural gas-fired power generation declined for the first time in four years](#) - According to our recently released Natural Gas Annual, natural gas consumption in all sectors in the United States was effectively flat between 2020 and 2021, down by only 0.5 billion cubic feet per day (Bcf/d).
